- Glass bottles and jars only (all colours)
- Please rinse all bottles and jars
- Place in your crate
- NO broken glass or any other types of glass
- Broken glass and light bulbs go into the general waste bin

# Plastic



fruit juice, all other plastic goes into your residual waste bin, Please remove caps, wash and

Grade 1 – 2 only e.g. milk and

cream bottles, water bottles,


- squash

# Cans



- Please rinse all food cans
- Remove the lids and place inside of cans (flattened preferred - no need to remove labels)
- Place in your crate

# Paper



- All grades of paper and cardboard
- Please flatten all cardboard and and tie together if needed to reduce flying away
- Place beneath your bin if oversize



# Greenwaste

80 kg weight limit

The 240 litre Greenwaste bin can be used to dispose of:



- Lawn clippings
- Weeds
- Leaves (no flax)
- Old plants
- Soft prunings



DO NOT load with soil/concrete/bricks or put any food waste contaminants in your bin.
